Judge Yolanda Orozco was appointed to the Los Angeles Superior Court on December 6, 2010. She currently presides over an unlimited jurisdiction civil department at the Stanley Mosk Courthouse. Judge Orozco previously sat in criminal, probate and personal injury assignments. Prior to her appointment to the bench, Judge Orozco was a partner at the international law firm of Jones Day where she litigated complex business disputes.

For the past six years, Judge Orozco has been the Chair of the Court's Diversity Committee. Through the Diversity Committee, Judge Orozco has organized the Court's Judicial Diversity Summits and the Young Women and Young Men Leadership Conferences at the Court. Judge Orozco is a member of the Outreach and Mentor Committees of the LASC Judicial Mentor Program. She is currently a member of the Court's Fairness and Access Committee and presides over the Downey Teen Court. Judge Orozco is a member of the Board of the California Judges' Association and a member of the California Latino Judges' Association.

Judge Orozco is a Trustee of the Mexican American Bar Foundation, a non-profit that yearly awards scholarships to area law students. Previously, Judge Orozco was a Commissioner to the Los Angeles City Planning Commission, president of the Federal Bar Association (LA Chapter) and a member of Senator Dianne Feinstein's Judicial Screening Committee. Judge Orozco served on the board of the Public Welfare Foundation, based in Washington, D.C., and on the Board of the Western Center on Law & Poverty.
